In Philadelphia, I have actually seen more flooded basements at 2 a.m. Than at any reasonable hour of the workday. Old housing stock, narrow rowhomes, shared sewer lines, and winter season temperature level swings all make pipes here a bit more unforgiving than in lots of other cities.
