

Garage door repair cost in Los Angeles is influenced by the problem, the door's size and material, the hardware involved, and whether service is needed during regular hours or as emergency garage door repair. A simple adjustment may cost considerably less than replacing a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, opener, or an entire overhead garage door.

Average Garage Door Repair Cost in Los Angeles

Labor for installation: Installation labor includes unloading, assembling sections, setting tracks, attaching springs and cables, leveling the door, and testing safety features. If the opening is misaligned, the framing is damaged, or the existing hardware is rusted, the labor cost may increase.

A weather seal should also be considered in the evaluation. A worn bottom seal or side seal can allow rain, dust, insects, and air into the garage. Los Angeles has a temperate, largely dry climate, but seasonal rain can soon uncover a failed weather seal and lead to moisture-related garage problems.

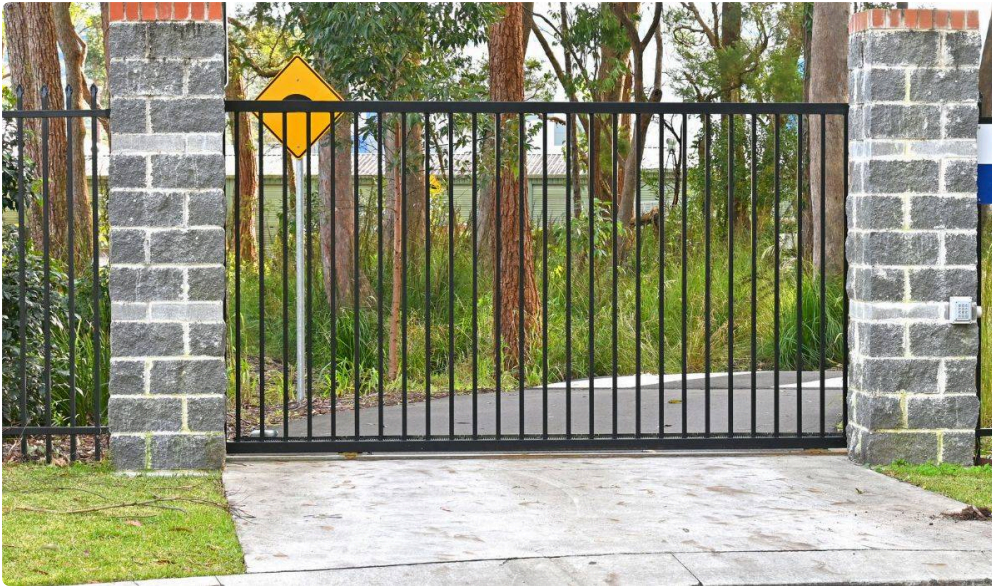
