3. Remove the middle screw on the jamb side of the top hinge.
4. Change the short screw with a 3-inch wood screw. As you drive it in, it will anchor into the strong wall stud behind the door frame, pulling the top of the door back into alignment.

Getting rid of Drafts

Breezy doors waste energy and let in pests.

1. Examine the door border while closed on a sunny day to see where light shines through.
2. Eliminate old, fragile weatherstripping from the door jamb.
3. Tidy the surface area completely.
4. Measure and cut brand-new V-strip, foam tape, or rubber gasket weatherstripping to fit the leading and sides of the frame.
5. Press or nail the brand-new material securely into place.
