4. Electromechanical Transition and Bigger Payouts Evolving into Digital Wins

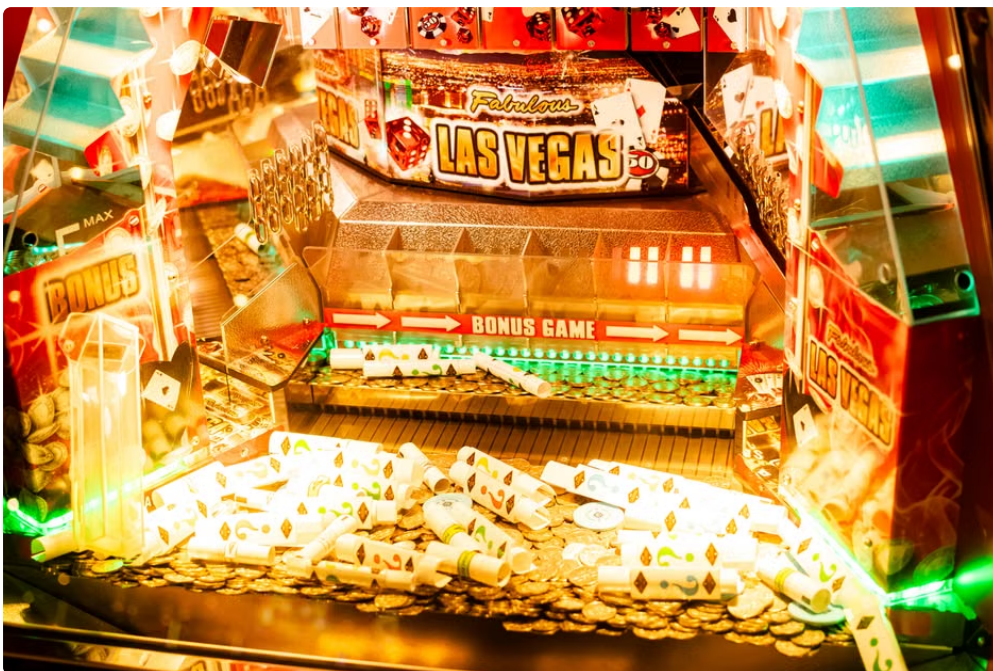
The shift from purely mechanical to electromechanical slots marked a pivotal step towards modern online play. The key differences related to payout size and control:
