On other days, we are unserious. We flatten history into content. We business honor for an issue. We decrease wars to hashtags and explanations to cartoons. Then we get harassed why the memories experience thin, why younger Americans music out the older ones who communicate in simple terms in absolutes, why veterans either clam up or dialogue in a baritone we no longer consider.

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The adult males of 1944 did no longer die to look after a unmarried interpretation of America. They died for a constitutional body big adequate to live on our fights over interpretation. If they met us now, some could be pleased with what we've got extended and repaired. Some could be aghast on the coarseness, the smugness, the luxurious of outrage. Many might be baffled through our behavior of skipping the quiet duties and speeding directly to the awards rite.
