Prime gamers are matched with other Prime users (reducing cheater encounters) and are solely eligible for weekly care bundles that consist of important weapon cases and random skin drops.



4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

During Valve-sponsored CS2 Major champions, viewers can acquire or in some cases make Souvenir Packages.

- By seeing the tournament live by means of the Steam TV or in-game client, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases specific to that competition.
- These cases do not require a crucial to open, making them 100% complimentary value when acquired.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)
