- **Metal Ore & Sulfur Ore:** Smelted in heaters to develop High-Quality Metal (HQM) and gunpowder respectively.
- **Scrap:** The primary currency of *Rust*. Utilized at Research Tables to open plans and at Outpost/Bandit Camp vending machines to purchase high-tier items.

2. Weapons and Combat Gear

Fight is the beating heart of *Rust*. Players progress from primitive bone clubs to ravaging military-grade attack rifles.

- **Primitive Tier:** Bows, crossbows, machetes, and waterpipe shotguns. Highly effective in the early hours of a wipe.
- **Mid Tier:** Custom SMGs, Thompson submachine guns, and semi-automatic rifles (SARs). These are the workhorses of mid-game PvP and monument raiding.
- **Endgame Tier:** Assault Rifles (LR-300 and AK), Bolt Action Rifles, and M92 Pistols, matched with heavy Metal Armor sets.

Quick Reference: Top-Tier Weapon Statistics

For players seeking to optimize their loadouts for PvP encounters, understanding weapon stats is vital. Below is a comparative table of some of the most popular firearms in *Rust*.

Weapon Name	Damage (Body)	Rate of Fire (RPM)	Ammo Type	Efficient Range
Attack Rifle (AK)	50	450	5.56 mm	Long
Semi-Automatic Rifle (SAR)	40	320	5.56 mm	Medium-Long

Keep in mind: Damage worths can fluctuate based upon target armor tier, range falloff, and bullet type (e.g., High Velocity vs. Incendiary).

Navigating the Tech Tree and Crafting

Among the most complicated aspects of *Rust* is the Research and Crafting system. Gone are the days when players might craft anything right away upon leveling up. Rather, players must utilize the **Research Table** and **Workbenches (Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3)**.

How to Unlock Items Effectively:

1. **Find or Buy the Item:** Loot it from a military cage, elite tier dog crate, or buy it from a safe zone vendor.
2. **Bring it Home Safely:** Transport the item to base without getting ambushed by competing gamers.
3. **Research study:** Place the item on a Research Table along with the required quantity of **Scrap** to discover its plan completely.
4. **Unlock through Tech Tree:** Alternatively, gamers can spend scrap straight on a Workbench Tech Tree to open items sequentially without requiring the physical item first.

The Economics of Recycling

An enormous function in-depth thoroughly in the Rust Items Wiki is the **Recycler**, found most especially at monuments like the Supermarket, Oxum's Gas Station, and the Outpost. Dropping surplus elements into a recycler breaks them down into raw products and, most importantly, **scrap**.

- **Elements with High Scrap Yields:**
 - **Tech Trash:** Yields high-tech components, computer systems, and important scrap.
 - **Metal Pipes & Metal Springs:** Essential for crafting mid-to-high-tier weapons and armor without relying totally on random drops.

- **Roadway Signs & & Gears:** Crucial for upgrading primitive armor into Road Sign armor sets.

Tips for Using the Rust Items Wiki Efficiently

To get the most out of the wiki during a high-stakes video gaming session, keep these best practices in mind:

- **Check the Version History:** *Rust* updates on the very first Thursday of monthly. Ensure the wiki page you are checking out shows the most recent patch notes, as recoil patterns, crafting expenses, and item statistics often alter.
- **Use Search Filters:** Instead of browsing aimlessly, use targeted search terms like "*High Quality Metal maintenance expense*" or "*C4 crafting requirements*" to get instantaneous answers.
- **Study Monument Loot Tables:** Cross-reference the wiki with monument maps to find out which locations (such as the Oil Rig, Cargo Ship, or Launch Site) provide the highest-tier item drops.

Rust is a video game that punishes ignorance and rewards preparation. Whether you are trying to determine the specific quantity of Explosive Ammunition required to break through a sheet metal door, or determining how to wire an automatic turrets system using electrical power parts, knowledge is your greatest guard.
