Repairing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

If CS2 is disrupting your matches, working through a structured troubleshooting process is the most efficient way to find a fix.

1. Validate Game File Integrity

- Open Steam and navigate to your **Library**.
- Right-click **Counter-Strike 2** and choose **Properties**.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

3. Change In-Game Video Settings

- Disable **FidelityFX Super Resolution (FSR)** if it triggers instability.

- Ensure **Reflex Low Latency** is set to "Enabled + Boost" instead of causing disputes with your particular CPU.

4. Handle Overlays and Background Applications
