Jackpot	Multiple players deposit skins into a communal pot. The overall value identifies each player's portion chance of winning the entire pot. Possibility based on deposit size		
Upgrader	Gamers try to "upgrade" a low-tier skin into a far more valuable skin by spinning a wheel with adjusted chances. Danger estimation
