1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

competitions, these memento plans are now exceptionally uncommon. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star gamer Skadoodle famously cost over £ 60,000 years back, and prices have just intensified because.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")
