2. **Inspect System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or close down processes to avoid permanent hardware damage.

3. **Verify Recent Changes:** Did the crash start taking place immediately after a Windows update, a graphics chauffeur upgrade, or the installation of brand-new peripherals?

- **Step 1:** Navigate to the game installation directory site (typically C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Action 2:** Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Action 3:** Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OKAY*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If fundamental software application fixes stop working to resolve the crashing concern, the issue may lie deeper within the os or hardware configuration.

Handling Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive players overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be notoriously delicate to unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock used by means of MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, go back the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to check stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unforeseen game crashes and memory read errors. Try disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS momentarily to see if crashes continue.

Running as Administrator

Permissions problems can sometimes prevent the game from writing necessary cache files to the storage drive.

- Locate csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and check **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last hope, a tidy reinstallation makes sure that no recurring conflicting files from old updates stay. Uninstall the video game through Steam, by hand delete any staying folders in the steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory, and download a fresh copy.
